About the University of Indianapolis and its Athens Campus

The Athens Campus

The University of Indianapolis, Athens Campus (UIA), located at the foot of the Acropolis, is the only wholly owned branch campus of a US university operating in Athens. The University of Indianapolis, Athens Campus offers 32 undergraduate programs and 9 graduate programs in Athens.



The University of Indianapolis, Athens Campus is accredited by the North Central Association of Schools and Colleges, and is also a founding member of the Association of American Colleges in Greece (AACG). Other specialized accreditations are held in Business (ACBSP), Psychology (APA) and Music (NASM).

The AHEPA Journey to Greece Program

Duration

The Journey to Greece will run for a duration of one month starting July 15 and ending August 17, 2007.

Courses

The Journey is a study tour and students choose two out of four courses:

- Elementary Modern Greek Language (Conversational and written Greek)
- Greek Art, Architecture and Archaeology
- The Politics and Foreign Policy of Modern Greece
- Mythology and Religion

These classes will not only provide an unforgettable learning experience but will also provide them with **six transferable university credits**. Academic credit is transferred to a student's home institution by an official transcript issued by the University of Indianapolis. Courses will incorporate visits to the archaeological sites, museums and the Foundation of the Hellenic World exhibition in Athens. Students will also benefit from use of the University Library, Computer lab, including internet access, and the magnificent University of Indianapolis Cultural Center located in the midst of the ancient ruins of Athens.

Accommodation

Students attending the program will be housed in very close proximity to the University in the Plaka area of Athens. The AHEPA Program Director and Counselors as well as University staff will be on hand to ensure the students' welfare.

Catering

Lunch is provided every weekday and all meals are provided on excursions. Students make their own arrangements for breakfast and dinner or the University can make arrangements as required at additional cost.

Excursions

Excursions, designed with learning in mind as much as having fun, form an integral part of the program. Guided by scholars, students will immerse themselves in the lives of the ancient Greeks and will fill their minds with art, politics, culture and mythology that defined Greece. Two excursions are planned for the program:

Two Day Island Weekend

A visit to the Saronic Gulf Island of Spetses with an overnight stay.

Three Day Sparti Excursion

Sparti, Gythio, Mystras, Tripoli (sponsored by the AHEPA Educational Foundation and hosted by the Daughters of Penelope, Sparti).



Four Day Excursion

Excursion with hotel accommodation to Meteora, Delphi, Arachova, Antirrio-Rio Bridge, Epidavros, Mycenae, Corinth.

Visits with the US Ambassador to Greece and the Archbishop are also planned.

Plus..... visits to the Acropolis, Sounion, Museums of Athens, the Foundation of the Hellenic World Exhibition and a welcome event organized by Athens Chapter HJ-1 and Swimming Pool Party organized by Glyfada Chapter HJ-2.

COST PER PERSON: \$1875 per student - \$1750 for returning students who attended the 2006 Journey

These prices apply for students registering before January 1, 2007 after this date a late registration of \$150 will be applied.



(Prices include accommodation in Athens and on excursions, all transport on excursions, weekday lunch meal plan and all meals on excursions, tuition and transcripts. Flights and travel outside of Greece not included).
